EITC Foundation Scholarship Ceremony

The Annual EITC Foundation Scholarship Ceremony was held on Wednesday, April 8, 2015 at the Shilo Inn to honour scholarship recipients for their academic achievements. All Civitans were invited to attend for the presentation of scholarships. Dave Purcell, Idaho Falls Civitan President was in attendance to present the Civitan Scholarship certificates. The Idaho Falls Civitans have been involved annually supporting students with disabilities by sponsoring scholarships but this year they increased their support of the scholarship program significantly. In the past the club has contributed \$4,500 helping three students, this past year a proposal to increase support for the scholarship program was approved. The Civitans donated \$10,000 to help ten students this year with their educational expenses.

All of the qualified applicants had to complete an EITC Scholarship Application, prepare a 1-page personal statement and retain a letter of recommendation from a non-family member. The students had to also have proper documentation of their disability on file with the EITC Disability and Resource Services Coordinator, Irene Jones who recently joined the Civitans. Tanner Gleave, Civitan Board Member was instrumental in organizing a review committee to make the selections, all those who did not receive a scholarship from the Civitans were reviewed for our EITC General Scholarships and did receive a scholarship even if they were not selected by the Civitans.



The ceremony was a great success and was also an opportunity to educate those in attendance on who the Civitans are and what we do in the community. Overall, the EITC Foundation handed out 160 scholarships amounting to nearly \$200,000. The event had more than 650 in attendance a combination of students, guests, contributors, staff, faculty and EITC Foundation Board of Directors. The EITC Foundation believes that this

event will continue to grow with each year. "The EITC Foundation is extremely grateful for the continued support of the Idaho Falls Civitans by providing scholarship opportunities to those with disabilities", says EITC Foundation Executive Director, Natalie Hebard.
