
Heart of the West District Newsletter 12/2020

News From International Director Ann McCarty

Happy New Year to All Civitans of the Heart of the West! October brings all of us to the beginning of our 2020-2021 Civitan Year. The Past and future of Zoom communication for Civitans to meet in a large group. Boy how we have learned to communicate virtually! October started the year of Champions of Service where our new International President Frank Kelly and his fellow Governors chose the phrase to be (Leaders.) These Governors and Governors-Elect began their training October 10, 2020, by online webinars. The International Board started their year with the continuations of the past Board members from last year except a vacancy of President-Elect. Our

first Board meeting was Oct.10, 2020, where we addressed the merger of the California District to merge with the Heart of the West. The Merger Committee is being led by Teresa Wakeman, HOTW, and Linda Colley, California District. Both these ladies are highly qualified to lead this merger with their history of serving Civitan International as past International Board Directors and Governors of their District not to mention that they both have served as leaders in their local clubs and belong to several different clubs. As the International Director, I have presented to the International Board our timeline, bylaws, policy manuals, and updates of all sub-committees. The Int. board has approved all documents that have been presented, as of November 14, 2020. The International Board will review again updated bylaws, and subcommittee updates on January 9, 2021. Thank You to all the subcommittee leaders from the HOTW and California District for all your guidance and dedication to serve. In January, the International Board will review the final plans of the merger.

October's board meeting was a very rewarding event because the Board attended the Civitan International Research Center Reception via Zoom with Dr. Powell and all the recipients of Science Awards. These outstanding Scientists were Dr. Mathew Alexander PHD receiving the McNulty Award with his research that focuses on identifying new ways to understand the disease pathology and identifying new treatments for childhood neuromuscular disorders. Dr. Alexander is a member of the Research Civitan Club and frequently speaks to Civitan clubs and districts about his work, which utilizes zebrafish. The recipients of the 2020 Civitan Emerging Scholar awards are Austin Svancaran, M.A., Reagan Pennock, Ph.D., and Norimichi Ito, Ph.D. Svancara works in UAB's Translational Research for Injury Prevention Laboratory (UAB TRIP Lab) where he studies how to improve the driving safety of individuals with autism and attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder. Pennock works in the lab of Dr. Jacques Wadiche in the UAB Department of Neurobiology where he uses electrical and high-resolution optical recordings to study a non-standard form of transmission in the cerebellum portion of the brain. Ito works in the lab of Shin-ichi Kano, M.D., Ph.D. where they are addressing the mechanism underlying how our immune system impacts brain function, especially social behavior. Civitan International will once again give out its prestigious World Citizenship Award, at the 2021 annual convention in Jacksonville, Florida. This year's recipient will be Lorri Unumb, an attorney and parent advocate who has pushed for laws nationwide that better the lives of those with autism. The award is rarely given and will put Unumb in a list of recipients who include President Dwight Eisenhower and Eunice Kennedy Shriver, founder of Special Olympics. The Civitan International Board also carried out the following actions October's meeting: Approved a bylaw change for Junior Civitan International that will create flexibility for their elections of International officers. This will still need ratification by Juniors at their convention in June. Appointed an ad hoc committee to review the training program provided by Civitan International. Narrowed down host cities of the Civitan International Convention in 2022 to San Antonio, Texas; Albuquerque, New Mexico; and Indianapolis, Indiana. The membership report for the first month of the 2020-2021 year came out on November 6.

It shows 11,230 adult members in North America. Combine that with Junior Civitan membership and clubs in Europe, Asia, and Africa, the organization stands at around 22,000 total members across the world. The last nine months have been especially challenging because of the COVID-19 pandemic, but many of the clubs that have surrendered their charters were in difficult shape before the emergency. The virus's effects just complicated their issues. Civitan International is here to help any clubs that need support during this time. Please reach out to growth@civitan.org for access to new tools, financial assistance, and ideas to recruit/ hold meetings and projects during this time. Civitan International operates with a mission to build good citizenship by providing a volunteer organization of clubs.

OFFICER TRAINING If your officers are repeating in their positions and trained in 2019, they are NOT required to train again this year to receive certification, but are encouraged to take it to learn new information. If your officers are repeating in their position and did NOT train in 2019 or are new to their officer roles, they will need to train to receive certification. Deadline for officer certification is December 16, 2020. Registration is open for Presidents and Presidents Elect at https://civitan.org/online-leadership-training/. Secretary and Treasurer training is also available now at https://civitan.org/training.. I have had the honor to help facilitate the training session this fall with Past International President Patsy Perkal, Ken Adkins, and Megan Mindel.
