News From International Director Ann McCarty



Spring is in the air fellow Heart of the West Civitans! There's a lot happening in the world of Civitan: Clergy Appreciation month just blessed us with the great story of the Four Chaplains that went down with the US Dorchester ship; staff and directors have been presenting Town Halls to educate members to the RENEW BY 2022; and March brings our members honoring those Servant Hearts. Our world is trying to rise to the future without the shadow of COVID-19. I hope my message finds you all healthy and safe. Congratulations to the Civitan Club Holmestrand in Norway with 50 Years and Civitan Russellville of Alabama North District 85 Years, in service to others as Civitans. Our hearts are still heavy with the loss of Past President Bob Jones. March 8th brings us International Women's Day! Did you know Civitan was the **first** Civic organization to allow women to join? Civitan will also honor Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month in March.

As members welcome in the new year, plans are underway for events in 2021. That includes the 101st Civitan International Convention planned for

Jacksonville, Florida, in July. International President Frank Kelley and two staff from World Headquarters visited the city this month to meet with the host hotel team and look at potential golf tournament sites. Safety measures were reviewed in light of the COVID-19 pandemic and will continue to be at the forefront of discussions as the convention nears. More information will be coming out soon as to how to register and what activities are planned. The Civitan International Board of Directors has met twice since the fall. One of the most critical decisions made by the group was the approval of a new set of bylaws for the organization. An article in this edition of Civitan Magazine details that proposal. Some other actions that took place at the meetings in November and January include: • Approved the merger of the California District and the Heart of the West District, as presented • Changed the required number of charter members for a club in North America to 15 • Created a policy that defines a member's home club when that individual is a member of more than one club • Certified two candidates for the election for Civitan International President 2021-2022 who are: Dan Brown of the Great Southwest District and Fred Matthies of the Great Southwest District. Minutes of the International Board meetings are available to any member by request. Those records along with several others on the International level can be found in the Member Center on the Civitan website under "International Board." Many clubs are dealing with COVID-19 directly as their members have battled the virus.

Bob Jones 1944-2020 Past International President (2018-2019) Bob Jones passed away in December, after a few weeks of health issues. He had just completed his term on the board a few months earlier. Jones, who also was a past International Director and North Carolina West Governor, was a member of Civitan for more than thirty years. During his presidential year, the organization initiated many changes that will help mold its future like determining to sell the world headquarters and recommitting to the CIRC. Jones also was a member of the Breakthru golf tournament planning committee, a golf participant, an Honor Key (club, district, International) recipient, and a Light The Way supporter. He recently helped build the Cabarrus Civitan Club. Jones was passionate about Civitan's work for people with intellectual and

developmental disabilities. In a Civitan Magazine interview in 2018, he shared about his favorite projects. "With a family member who has been diagnosed with autism and a close personal friend who has a family member with Alzheimer's, the research at the Civitan International Research Center is very important to me. My hope is that very soon they will have answers to help those with I/DD and other debilitating conditions, " said Jones. "My next favorite project is Special Olympics. The joy and smiles on the faces of the athletes are beyond compare. Their attitude is something we can all learn from." Jones is survived by his wife Judy, sons Kevin and Michael, daughter-in-law Kandy, and grandchildren McKenzie, Hayden and Spencer. At the 2019 International Convention, Jones gifted his three grandchildren with Civitan Fellows.

BYLAWS PROPOSAL Over the past year and a half, the Civitan International Board of Directors journeyed through the revision of the organization's outdated Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. These governance documents were rewritten in 2004 and have had ten amendments over the years. The board appointed a Governance Documents Committee made up of Past International Presidents and Past International Directors. The committee, along with legal counsel, determined the need for a rewritten version rather than multiple amendments. The board and committee both reviewed past and current membership reports, club building statistics, leadership recruitment limitations and membership surveys. The committee provided recommendations to the board throughout the past year and presented a final draft of the new governance documents in November 2020. The board approved those documents. The Articles and Bylaws will now be presented to the membership and will be voted upon at this year's Civitan International Convention. The Articles require a positive two-thirds vote and the Bylaws require a majority vote (over 50%). The committee asked the questions: What if we could update the Bylaws and Articles while: modernizing some of our meeting and convention practices, revising the structure of the International Board to represent our membership numbers more equally, address some of our financial issues, and create a more streamlined and cost-effective governance structure? Civitan membership losses over the past 7 years before the pandemic have been very high. The organization has lost 35% of its membership. Many districts are having serious difficulty recruiting candidates for district offices and finding club builders. The Governance Committee and International Board realized that a downsizing of our organization and some far-reaching changes would be required if Civitan is to survive and thrive for the next generation. Under the umbrella of Renew by 2022, here are some highlights of the changes that will be presented to the membership over the next six months prior to the 2021 International Convention, where delegates will have the opportunity to discuss and to vote upon these revised documents: • Brings the documents in line with current Alabama Nonprofit Law and IRS regulations. • Simplifies and clarifies the membership classes, creating more opportunities for new types of membership. • Allows for virtual International Conventions or hybrids of virtual and in-person conventions. • Allows all paid registered delegates in good standing at an International Convention to vote. • Provides for the possibility of electronic voting. • Redefines the post of Civitan International Treasurer as a non-staff volunteer position as a means of providing external oversight of our finances. • Reorganizes the regions/division structure to provide Regional Leadership Councils as the conduit between clubs and Civitan International, replacing the current district structure and creating a direct link between clubs and the International Board through each Region's International Director. • Provides a reduction in dues for most clubs because of the elimination of district dues; allows for a smaller Regional Fee to be charged to clubs to be used for new resources and trainings. • Provides International members (outside North America) with a single International Division, including the opportunity to be represented on the Board of Directors with its own International Director. • Allows for a small Cost of Living increase in dues as an option for the Board (with a 2% cap) instead of larger increases every few years. Redistributes International Director positions geographically so that the organization's members are represented more equally.

Have you been anxiously awaiting news related to the 2021 International Convention, if it would happen, how it would happen, and what would happen in light of the global pandemic and travel restrictions? Great news, the answers are here! Save the dates to join us in Service, Knowledge and Fellowship, **July 28-31, 2021 (take note of new dates).**

You spoke, and we listened. Due to the ongoing pandemic restrictions going on across the world, the Civitan International Board of Directors voted to give a "one-time" exemption to the Civitan International Bylaws to allow for a **hybrid convention for 2021**. That means, there will be two options for members to attend: in-person in Jacksonville or virtually through their personal computer/device.

The in-person experience will be very similar to what it has always been, except with COVID-19 preventive measures being taken. International elections and voting business will take place with in-person registrants taking part in the certification process and placing their votes. Aligned events like the President's Council donor reception, the Civitan International Annual Breakthru Golf Benefit, and the Welcome Party will all still be taking place, face to face.

The virtual participation experience will include online admittance into the First Business Session, the Elections Business Session and Membership Extravaganza. It also includes the opportunity to vote in International Elections and governance documents proposals, if applicable. This means more Civitans than ever before will have the chance to participate in voting and elections, making their voice heard in shaping the future of our organization. A registration fee of \$50 USD will still be assessed for this opportunity.

Civitan International will be utilizing elections software to help with the online voting process. Certification will still take place, and measures are being taken to ensure voting is secure and compliant to the bylaws and policies that are in existence under typical circumstances. Any voting delegate participating in this year's online process will need to have access to e-mail in order to participate. There will be no exceptions for those who do not have email addresses and internet capabilities.

More information will be coming out soon regarding the details of the process, particularly with the virtual participation and online voting experience. Please monitor your email and CI's website for any news related to the convention. You can also join the Facebook group set up within the Civitan International Facebook page for the convention for the latest updates. In the meantime, please ensure your contact information (email and phone numbers) is updated at world headquarters and that your club is taking the necessary steps to be in good standing in order to take part in this unique year for voting.
