News from Idaho – BANNOCK CIVITAN INDOOR GOLF RUNRAISER


BANNOCK CIVITAN INDOOR GOLF FUNDRAISER BEATS PREVIOUS RECORD.

For a one day event, the Bannock Civitan Indoor Golf Tournament, in its 24th year as a community event, is one of the club's biggest fund raisers. Players came from all over Idaho and Utah to play this year. This event also gives 18 bars and restaurants a chance to make some money that day, as well.

The tournament was held on February 25, 2012. It is a mini putt golf tournament held in 18 bars and restaurants. Each bar and restaurant builds their own hole and a prize is awarded to the best hole.

A committee of 12 Civitan members met in early January to plan the event. Posters were placed by Civitan members and an entry form was mailed to past participants, placed on the Bannock Civitan website and on the Bannock Civitan Facebook page. Civitans and their friends volunteered to judge the event. 36 businesses donated prizes for the raffle. 38% of club members participated in some way -volunteering, gathering prizes, marketing the event.etc.

\$17,339 was the gross amount made which included team registration fees and raffle sales. **The tournament netted over \$16,250 for Civitan projects**. This was a gain of approximately \$1,000 from the previous year.

Volunteer Recruitment – At least two people per bar were needed to judge the holes. The tournament begins at 9:00 a.m. (volunteers started arriving at 7:30 a.m.) and ends at approximately 6:00 p.m. so it is a long day and volunteers commit their entire day for this event. Volunteers are also needed for raffle ticket sales and prize distribution, emcee for awards and prizes and two roaming judges to make sure teams do not get backed up along the way.

87 teams (5-person teams) played at 18 bars and restaurants. **There is also a costume contest**. Expenses included a season pass to the local golf course for the summer as a prize. The golf course gave us one if we bought one and we raffled off both passes. T-shirts were printed but the t-shirts were donated by the local Budweiser Distributor. Indoor Golf paid for mailing the entry forms Printing of posters and entry forms were donated by a Civitan member's business.

As an added thank you, Volunteer Certificates and Prize Certificates are sent to each volunteer, prize sponsor and hole sponsor after the event is over.

LESSONS FROM THE GEESE!!

Lessons from Geese 'Individual empowerment results from quality honking'

Lessons from Geese provides a perfect example of the importance of team work and how it can have a profound and powerful effect on any form of personal or business endeavor. When we use these five principles in our personal and business life it will help us to foster and encourage a level of passion and energy in ourselves, as well as those who are our friends, associates or team members. It is essential to remember that teamwork happens inside and outside of business life when it is continually nurtured and encouraged.

Lesson 1 - The Importance of Achieving Goals As each goose flaps its wings it creates UPLIFT for the birds that follow. By flying in a 'V' formation the whole flock adds 71 percent extra to the flying range. **Outcome** When we have a sense of community and focus, we create trust and can help each other to achieve our goals.

Lesson 2 - The Importance of Team Work When a goose falls out of formation it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of flying alone. It quickly moves back to take advantage of the lifting power of the birds in front. **Outcome** If we had as much sense as geese we would stay in formation with those headed where we want to go. We are willing to accept their help and give our help to others.

Lesson 3 - The Importance of Sharing When a goose tires of flying up front it drops back into formation and another goose flies to the point position. **Outcome** It pays to take turns doing the hard tasks. We should respect and protect each other's unique arrangement of skills, capabilities, talents and resources.

Lesson 4 - The Importance of Empathy and Understanding When a goose gets sick, two geese drop out of formation and follow it down to the ground to help and protect it. **Outcome** If we have as much sense as geese we will stand by each other in difficult times, as well as when we are strong.

Lesson 5 - The Importance of Encouragement Geese flying in formation 'HONK' to encourage those up front to keep up with their speed. Outcome We need to make sure our honking is encouraging. In groups and teams where there is encouragement, production is much greater. 'Individual empowerment results from quality honking'
