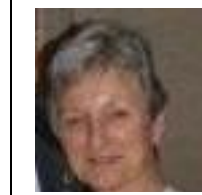

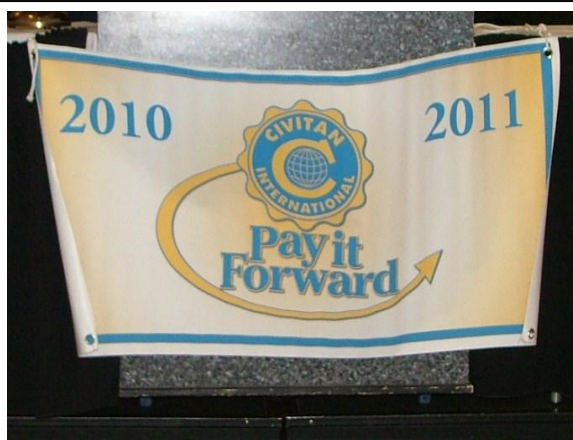
It has been a privilege and pleasure serving as your Governor the past year. I appreciate very much all the assistance, advice and encouragement you provided!



The August 3rd Idaho Falls Civitan Club's **Alive After Five** event is proud to **be the** Kick Off **introduction** for the first Annual Summer Feast to be held September 10th in down town Idaho Falls. The 2011 Summer Feast **will benefit the Kern Family** (Mike & Bobby), **who lost their two daughters and two grandsons in May to a horrible act of violence. The purpose of this new annual event is to raise awareness of domestic violence and hopefully help prevent other families from experiencing such a tragedy. Proceeds raised from this event will help Mike and Bobby Kern with their fresh start.**

As you can imagine, Mike and Bobby are unable to return to the family home **where** the homicides of their children and grandchildren **occurred. Additionally, the home was severely damaged by** the fire that was set inside their home **during this tragedy.** They are currently residing in temporary housing. The community would like now to assist them in establishing a **fresh start by assisting them with funds for a down payment on a** new home and honor the loss of their family.
