As Civitan clubs there are certain items that are required from us from entities like the IRS. Please make sure you know your club's tax-exempt status and are filing the necessary reports, like a 990, with the government each year. If you need assistance with any matters involving your club's tax-exempt status or your 990, please call world headquarters and ask for Laura or Mary.

Preparations are underway for the 2019 International Convention in Greenville, South Carolina. Registration has opened on our website, along with registration for the fundraisers that usually happen alongside with the event, like golf and Civitan Fest. Check out www.civitan.org for more details.
